Code of Conduct

Student Responsibilities

Students are required to act and behave in a courteous, sensible, considerate and orderly manner when attending lessons.

Students have the responsibility to respect the rights and properties of others, and must take care to protect their own health and safety and the safety of others.

Students have the right to expect professionalism and honesty from teachers.

This involves creating and managing a learning environment where all students can participate equally. Teachers have the responsibility to seek to prevent student behaviour that may hinder academic progress.

Health and Safety

Teachers are responsible for the management and provision of safe / healthy working / teaching / learning conditions.

Standards of Teacher

A teacher is expected to treat the public and students with respect and courtesy, and handle all resources at their disposal in an efficient, responsible and accountable manner. Every effort must be made to maintain high teaching and organisational standards. The teacher is required to observe all relevant legislation requirements.

Every endeavour will be made to produce excellence in musical skills and standards according to the student's abilities. However, in the final analysis, professional advancement and success depend not only on the teacher's input, but also on the support and encouragement of Parents / Caregivers and on the student's own initiative, diligence and general intellectual calibre.

These guidelines have been developed to ensure that studio teachers and students are aware of the Code of Conduct and its requirements.

Mandatory Reporting

Teachers have a responsibility to make themselves aware of the current legislation on mandatory reporting. Studio Teachers are legally mandated notifiers under section 11 (1) and (2) of the Children Protection Act 1993.

Any person that is employed in health, education, child care or residential services wholly or partly for children or young people in the actual delivery of services to children or young people, or holds a management position in the organisation, including Studio Music Teachers are legally mandated.
